Promote and educate teams on stigma reduction strategies in key sectors including healthcare, law enforcement, and education.

Guide HTF speakers and others in the community to examine presentations through a lens that promotes compassions and understanding for people suffering from substance use disorder.

Created Code of Ethics focused on Stigma Reduction for guest speakers presenting to the HTF.

Engaged law enforcement leaders in key discussions about person first language and stigma reduction strategies.

Hosted guest speaker: National Stigma Reduction expert, Rachael Cooper.

HTF partners participated in a survey to gauge awareness levels on Stigma.



SUPPORT RECOVERY

The focus of the <u>Support Recovery</u>
<u>Action Team</u> is to provide recovery
support for both individuals and their
families battling substance use
disorder.

Transition support during and after incarceration.

Ensuring individuals with a substance use disorder have access to life skills training programs.

Continuing to improve access to life saving harm reduction strategies.

Created a community partners collaborative <u>Community Resource</u> <u>Guide.</u>

Conducting focus groups with those in recovery to identify needs.

Working with Waukesha County HHS leadership and supporting their work with the jail system.

METRICS & MEASUREMENT

The focus of the M & M Action Team to is to improve data literacy among HTF community partners, standardize metrics for the work of the action teams, and support the action teams by seeking relevant data.

Assist HTF members in accessing reliable and timely county level substance use data.

Educate HTF members to understand the basic foundations of data analysis.

Support all of the HTF Action Teams to ensure they have meaningful indicators and data to support their action plans.

Provided data literacy training to the HTF membership.

Continue to meet with all action teams to assist with data needs and help teams focus their efforts on meaningful initiatives.

Developed and distributed a survey to analyze the data literacy level of HTF partners in order to better understand future educational needs.

CHIP SUBSTANCE USE

Working in collaboration with the Waukesha County Public Health Department, the <u>CHIP</u>
<u>Substance Use Action Team</u> is examining opportunities to support system level changes.

Reducing the number of opioid related deaths for Waukesha county residents 18-44 years old by ensuring access to life saving interventions including access to Certified Peer Specialists.

Examining access to stable housing for people with substance use disorder.

This team is currently developing their action plans that will officially launch in early 2024.
